TAX CAP RAISED

At the February Town Meeting, Council passed a Charter amendment that will raise the Town's tax cap from 50 cents (\$.50) to 58 cents (\$.58) for the upcoming (FY09) year which starts on July 1, 2008. The tax cap for tangible personal property tax (business tax) was raised to \$1.20. Currently the Town's actual tax rate for property taxes is 48 cents (\$.48) per \$100 assessed value. The tax cap is not the tax rate, rather the ceiling above which the Town's tax rate cannot exceed and raising the tax cap is not the same as raising taxes. Council felt that 2 cents was not enough of a cushion if the Town had an emergency and had to raise taxes more than that 2 cents margin. During recent budget meetings, Council has discussed the possibility of raising taxes but at this time I would say that it is most of the Council's intention to leave the actual tax rate at 48 cents. Residents are encouraged to participate in these upcoming meetings as we weigh Town services and expenditures against expected revenues.

CHEVERLY SCHOOLS

There have been many questions and some rumors concerning two of Cheverly's schools, Gladys Noon Spellman and The Judith P.Hoyer Early Childhood Center. A number of concerned parents have approached me or Councilmembers about issues at these two schools and the future of the Hoyer Center. While the Town and Town Council do not have any direct control over school administration, we can exert some influence or at least set up a forum so residents can express their concerns and get current, accurate information.

The Town Council, as well as the State Delegates Ramirez and Ivey have been working with the PTA's at both Gladys Noon Spellman and Judith Hoyer in an effort to improve our local schools. Oretha Bridgwaters (Regional Supervisor, Region II, for Prince George's County Public Schools) has attended local PTA meetings and has begun working with the PTA's

in developing plans for improvement. These plans are still being formulated, but Ms Bridgwaters has agreed to attend a Town Meeting for education in March to outline these plans prior to finalization.

Thanks to Councilmember RJ Eldridge (Co-Chair of Cheverly's Education Committee) and CM's Callahan, Ford and Watson for spearheading these efforts. We will publicize all upcoming meetings in the newsletter, on cable and on the web site as well as email information to all subscribers to Town email. If you have children in any of our schools or just want to get information, I encourage you to attend.

CONCRETE BATCHING PLANT APPROVED

As we feared, the application for the proposed concrete batching plant at 5800 Sheriff Road, just outside of Town in Seat Pleasant, was approved by the County's Zoning Hearing Examiner (ZHE). This decision was rendered on January 30th and the Town has 30 days in which to appeal. Council decided at the February Town Meeting that we will appeal this decision and in doing so join the Cedar Heights Citizens Association and other neighboring groups as well as Cheverly organizations such as the Friends of Lower Beaver Dam Creek and others. This will now go to the County Council siting as the District Council.

POSSIBLE CHANGES IN THE NEWSLETTER POLICY

Council has been approached by several groups and a number of individuals in Town concerning the Town's newsletter and Community Center use policies. Historically, it has been the policy that only sanctioned town groups could post meeting announcements in the newsletter or request meeting space at the Community Center. There are very definite guidelines for these groups but basically they must be predominantly comprised of Cheverly residents, be non-partisan or political, non-religious and register membership and officer lists and bylaws with the Town. Some of these groups include the Cheverly Boys and Girls Club, the Ward 4 Civic Association, The Cheverly Garden Club, Golden Circle, Homemakers' Club, Recreation Council, Woman's Club and the Cheverly Parent Resource Center.

Mayor FYI cont'd

The Town has always adhered to this strict policy as it pertains to elected officials as well. Elected officials, including our own Delegates and Senators have not held meetings at the Community Center, rather they have appeared at Town meetings at the invitation of the Town. Candidate forums have been sponsored by non-partisan groups such as the League of Women Voters or Cheverly's Woman's Club.

Groups such as Progressive Cheverly as well as other individuals have asked Council to review these policies as they consider them to be unnecessarily restrictive and counter productive to getting valuable community information out to our residents. Some maintain that restrictive as it is, the newsletter isn't read by many or relevant to residents. Would residents like to see announcements of meetings of the Saint Ambrose Mens Club, Progressive Cheverly or the Young Republican's Club if it also meant that there would be announcements by (and I am unaware that there is one) the Young Nazi Party of Cheverly? Should we accept advertising? Would residents like to see ads from local babysitting companies if it also meant we had to accept advertising from a local Adult Only store. Similar questions have been asked about the building use policy. Who should be able to use the Community Center? If a partisan group sponsors candidate's forum which would be of interest to residents, should they be able to hold it in the Community Center? What is a partisan group? These are complicated questions often involving first amendment issues, Maryland Sunshine laws as well as common sense issues like who monitors compliance etc.

Council has decided to tackle the easiest decision first--the newsletter. We will first tackle the question of announcements in the newsletter. We will be discussing this in meetings in the months ahead and I urge every resident in Town to voice their opinion either by attending the meetings, watching on cable or emailing me and your Councilmembers.

SIX THINGS YOU CAN DO TO MAKE CHEVERLY SAFER

#1 Most Cheverly burglaries are door entries. Check the deadbolt strike plate on the doorframe of all entry doors and make sure the attaching screws are 2-1/2” to 3” long. Unless these lock strike plates are screwed into the framing of your home, you are not protected against illegal entry and only minimal force is necessary to gain entry.

#2 Employ “The Club” on your parked vehicle at all times. This includes actually locking the device since thieves can tell by the position of the locking mechanism whether the device is locked or not.

#3 Consider using a fluorescent lighting fixture and timer combination on all outdoor lighting. Set the timer for dusk to dawn operation, and leave the light switch on. This “green” lighting costs pennies per day, provides sufficient but not obtrusive light, does not require daily attention, and is a deterrent to crime. If you want to use a fluorescent unit with a photoelectric cell, you must purchase such a unit self-contained. Most fluorescent lights will not currently work with an insertable photoelectric cell addition. If you have questions, call me at (301) 341-1055.

#4 Call the Police Department if you are leaving you home for more than a day or two. We provide security checks on your home while you are away for no cost. Call (301) 341-1055 or download the form from the Department’s website at www.cheverly-md.gov.

#5 If you are walking any distance, say from Metro to your home, try to walk with other people. Robbers tend to target single walkers. In addition, keep your cell telephone handy (or carry a free Cheverly whistle) and call 9-1-1 if you observe any suspicious activities. Remember, suspicious is a term that applies to your observations and feelings and not that of another.

#6 Join C-PACT or come to next meeting. C-PACT is for Cheverly residents and is the most reliable information source for activities that occur in the Town.

MULCH The Public Works Department has contracted with Maryland Environmental Services (MES) again this year to grind our leaves, yard waste, brush and Xmas trees into a fine grade mulch. Public Works will begin deliveries near the end of March. **Schedule a delivery now.**

Public Works keeps a large mound of the mulch at the town park parking lot near the ballfields for residents to help themselves.

Contact the PUBLIC WORKS OFFICE to schedule a mulch delivery. They are open Monday-Friday from **7:30AM to 4:00PM.**

You must fill out a delivery request form, pay the fee, and set up a delivery date.

NOTE: The Maximum for one delivery is two (2) scoops of the bulldozer.

The fee is \$20 per delivery. If you have any questions you can call **301-773-2666.**

Public Works can only deliver mulch where there is a driveway or a safe place to back their dump truck and tip the load on the lawn.

REMINDER: If you leave mulch on the lawn for very long—it will kill the grass underneath.
