#### **FY07 Town Budget and Tax Increase**

At the June Town meeting, the Town Council approved, by a 5-1 vote, the \$4.9 million FY07 Town Operating and Capital Improvement Budget. The approved budget includes a 5-cent tax increase for residents of the Town. This increase brings the Cheverly tax rate to 45 cents per \$100 of assessed value, one of the lowest rates for any municipality. As I reported in last month's FYI, approximately 2 cents of this increase funds the Cheverly Police Station that is currently under construction, and is the first phase of the expansion of the Community Center. We are still in hopes that there may be some additional funding for the Police Station in the County budget still before the County Council---so we will report on that next month.

The remaining increase will allow the Town to build back up the reserve fund, provide a 4.5% COLA (Cost of Living Adjustment) for Town employees, increases for Police salaries, 5 new police cruisers with on board computers and many other capital improvements for the Town which were itemized in last months newsletter.

#### **Cheverly Eagle Scouts**

Also at the June Meeting, the Council and I designated June as Boy Scout Eagle Scout Month in Cheverly, thereby honoring six (yes six!) young men in Cheverly who recently attained the rank of Eagle Scout. I had the privilege of attending two ceremonies honoring scouts from Troops 716 and Troop 257 who have contributed to their communities in many ways. It says a lot about Cheverly when a town our size can have this many scouts attain the rank of Eagle Scout all in one year. It also says a lot about our young people and the terrific

James Clark School of Engineering at the University of

**NATIONAL NIGHT OUT** – National Night Out (NNO), as the names suggests, is a nation-wide event that emphasizes the critical necessity of formulating citizen/police partnerships to reduce and deter crime in the United States. These partnerships are particularly necessary to reduce gun and drug violence, to ensure the safety of neighborhood homes and businesses, and to make all Cheverly streets and common areas safe places for children and adults alike. The traditional theme of NNO has usually centered on reclaiming areas of violence and entrenched crime. On a twist to this theme, Cheverly’s NNO will concentrate on spreading the word that our residents and business neighbors have declared Cheverly a “No Crime Zone,” meaning that outside threats to the welfare and safety of Cheverly residents and friends will not be tolerated.

**LOOK OUT** – On June 10, 2006, at approximately 1:55AM, a Cheverly resident was robbed at gunpoint by two black males operating a 1990’s Plymouth Voyager or Dodge Caravan, brown in color. If anyone sees a vehicle that is similar to this description riding around Cheverly, please call the police. Do not attempt to take any action on your own!

**CRIME TRENDS** – If you have read the Washington Post recently, you became aware that violent crime in the United States increased last year to the highest rate in 15 years, with a particularly high rise in robberies. Robberies in the District spiked up 14 percent, and in Prince George’s County, both homicides and robberies broke new records. The generally good news is that, in both jurisdictions, property crimes were slightly down.

In Cheverly in 2005, crime was up approximately 8%

for the year, principally because of thefts and vandalism in the Town. Robberies were up by 8%, burglaries were down by 9%, and stolen vehicles were up by 12%. **The good news for 2006 is: robberies are down by 10%, carjackings are down by 33%, assaults are down by 27%, burglaries are down by 5%, and stolen autos are down by a whopping 72%. What a way to reverse the trend!**

**AWARD WINNERS** – At the Thursday, June 8, 2006 televised Town Meeting, the following residents were given awards by the Cheverly Police Department and C-PACT for their outstanding contributions to law enforcement and to the safety of the Cheverly community. **BE AWARE OF LOTTERY SCAMS** – There has recently been a flood of mailings from lottery firms in Spain and Germany indicating that the receiver is eligible for a \$10 million prize. It all looks very official, with fancy stamps and important sounding names, but also says, “We ask you to keep this Award top secret from public notice until your claim has been processed.” The papers indicate that the receiver is not required to pay anything up front, but is required to fill out some type of processing form that asks for, among other things, your personal banking information and account numbers. **Please, do not provide any of this in-**

**formation or attempt to seek monies from these firms. This is nothing but a scam to obtain your information for means of fraud or identity theft.** If you receive these mailings or any others that ask for your personal information in exchange for a future prize, beware! If you have any questions about this topic, identity theft in general, or home improvement fraud, please do not hesitate to call the Cheverly Police.

**COMPUTERS IN POLICE VEHICLES** – The Cheverly Police Department currently has four vehicles equipped with mobile data terminals (MDT's), in-car computer systems that allow officers to view and respond to calls for service without having to use voice replies. In addition to calls, the system also provides nearly instant responses to vehicle and driver's license checks, wanted person checks, and quickly identifies stolen vehicles. In the new budget for fiscal year 2007, the Department will be purchasing five more MDT's which will make the police response to resident calls even quicker.

**WOMEN'S SELF-DEFENSE CLASS** – You can still sign up for the Women's Self-Defense Class being held on **Saturday, July 22, 2006**, at the Community Center. **The cost is \$20.** This class was specially formulated for young women going away to college, for women who walk the streets (I mean that in a good way) for exercise, and for women who want to learn how to diffuse situations before they become violent. **PEDESTRIANS AND SEATBELTS** – Every year, according to the Maryland Highway Safety Office, over 700 children under aged 16 are injured in pedestrian-traffic collisions. Most of these accidents occur when children run into the street or dart out between parked cars. In an effort to curb these injuries, the Cheverly Police Department requests that parents designate safe play areas away from streets and driveways. Thank you!

In addition, Maryland Child Passenger Safety Laws require the following:

\*\* A person may not transport a child younger than 6 years (regardless of weight) or one who weighs 40 pounds or less (regardless of age) in a motor vehicle unless the child is secured in a federally-approved safety seat.

\*\* A person may not transport a child younger than 16 years of age unless the child is secured in a child safety

seat or a vehicle's seat belt in all seating positions in all vehicles.

Note: A child younger than 16 years may not ride in an unenclosed cargo bed of a pick-up truck.

Any mounds of wood chips in the parks **IS FOR THE PARKS** and is not available for residents to take.

Public Works can only deliver mulch where there is a driveway or a safe place to back their dump truck and tip the load on the lawn.



**REMINDER:** If you leave mulch on the lawn for very long—it will kill the grass beneath.

Whenever you alter the ground in any way, the law requires that you contact Miss Utility first. If you don't and as a result damage an underground line, you'll have to pay for any repairs—and possibly face legal consequences.

Miss Utility will send out professional locators to your property to mark all buried lines that are owned by utilities indicating where it is not safe to dig. Always contact Miss Utility first. It's free, simple and it's the law.



## TAMING THE "TIGER"

Summer is here and so is the "Asian Tiger".

### REMINDER:

**Check your yard for ANY containers that can hold water.** Even the smallest amount of standing water (1 Tbsp.) can serve as a breeding site for the tiger mosquito. The 'Tiger' lays its eggs in these sites and they hatch within a few days of being flooded. Even small containers such as drinking cups can produce mosquitoes.

Spray sheltered areas in your yard with an insecticide labeled for adult mosquitoes.


