Message from the Chief - Buddy Robshaw

CRIME IN CHEVERLY – Crime in Cheverly is currently down some 18% from this time last year.

With the exception of the two tragic homicides and a slight rise in B&Es (37 in 2008 versus 41 in 2009), the numbers are down across all other crime categories including robberies, assaults, and stolen autos. The reason these numbers are down has a lot to do with the partnership this community has formed with its police department. More residents are reporting suspicious persons, vehicles, and circumstances than ever, and these calls appear to be interrupting the intent that many of these suspicious persons might have had toward committing other criminal acts. In addition, resident volunteers in the police radio program and the outstanding attendance of residents at the Cheverly Public Safety Day clearly have sent a strong message that the Cheverly community is committed to the reduction of crime and the improvement of the quality of life of all Cheverly residents, friends, and visitors. Residents, Job Well Done!

TIP OF THE DAY – The most prevalent item taken in a B&E appears to be laptop computers. All of these devices have serial numbers which must be reported if the item is pawned, which is the usual outlet for most stolen property. Persons selling or buying merchandise at a pawnshop must display photo identification to engage in any transaction, all of which are recorded electronically and are accessible to the Cheverly Police. Despite this reporting process, most Cheverly homeowners have not documented serial numbers on their home electronics, which makes the recovery of this type of stolen property extremely difficult. We could reduce B&Es in Cheverly by as much as 50% if serial numbers on items stolen in these crimes were previously documented by homeowners.

C-PACT MEETING – The next C-PACT Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, November 10, 2009, at 7:00 PM at the police station. Discussion will begin on how we can improve relationships in the community and how we can develop better partnerships to reduce crime.

SELF-DEFENSE CLASS FOR CHEVERLY WOMEN – The Department has heard from approximately 20 women who would be interested in forming another class. The instructors for this program usually require classes of at least 30 students. If you have any interest in this class, please call Janet at (301) 341-1055 so she can sign you up preliminarily. We are probably looking at a class date in January 2010.

ELDERWATCH – The CPD regularly visits the Town's elderly and infirmed in an effort to keep this important segment of the community up to date on crime issues and neighborhood events. These 10-15 minute visits are designed, not only for information sharing, but also to socialize. If any Cheverly resident knows of any elderly or infirmed persons living alone whom they believe would benefit from such contact, please notify Janet at the police station (301-341-1055).

LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES



Vacuum Leaves:

- Rake leaves between the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk - only on your assigned collection day.
- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day.

Bag Leaves: Yard waste is collected on

MONDAYS. Put bags at the curb on Sunday evening. Use **CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS** only (sold at Town Hall or Public Works - \$5 for 50 bags). Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags. **Bamboo is collected on Thur & Fri w/bulk trash.**
