HOUSE BILL 1016: The Maryland Legislature recently enacted House Bill 1016 which calls for, among other things,

police departments to post their policy manuals and complaint procedures on their websites with a link to the Maryland Police Training Commission (MPTC). Because the Department’s policy manual is extensive and because final complaint procedures have not been finalized by MPTC, the Department is in the process of making such material available in compliance with the law. We are working diligently with the Town’s legal staff and this information should be available very soon. Thank you for your cooperation.

COLUMBIA PARK ROAD TRAFFIC

ENFORCEMENT: The Cheverly Police Department is aware of the traffic congestion and lane changing issues that occur on Columbia Park Road at the Cheverly Metro Station. We are also aware of the traffic patterns and vehicle operations that affect pedestrians in the area. Aside from the fact that officers write a great number of traffic citations for violations that occur in the general area, the Department is also aware as to how enforcement further impedes traffic at this location given the small footprint of the roadway and the adjacent bridges. In the near future, officials from the Town will be meeting with County and State highway officials to discuss what can be done to minimize these violations and reduce congestion problems. In the interim, please forward any individual complaints about traffic problems at or near the Metro Station to my email (policechief@cheverly-md.gov) so that I can present these complaints as part of our discussions with these highway officials. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

RIGHT-OF-WAY ISSUES: One of the most frequent traffic violations that officers see in and around Cheverly concerns the issue of right-of-way. Right-of-way, according to the Annotated Vehicle Law of Maryland, Section 21-101, is the right of one vehicle or pedestrian to proceed in a lawful manner on a highway in preference to another vehicle or pedestrian. The most frequent violation of this preference occurs as vehicles exit ramps from one roadway onto another. The general belief is that, once a vehicle signals a merge from the ramp onto the highway, that vehicle is somehow given preference and other vehicles must slow down or yield to the merging vehicle. I have witnessed dozens of near crashes as merging vehicle force their way onto a roadway in lieu of slowing down or stopping until such a merge can be made safely. For the record, the preference is not given to the merging vehicle but to the traffic already traveling on the highway a vehicle is attempting to merge onto.

Failure to yield the right of way while merging is a traffic offense resulting in a fine of \$90 and 1 point on the violator’s driver’s license. If the failure to yield results in a traffic accident, the fine is \$130 and 3 points on a driver’s license. In addition to being a specific violation, recent studies of road rage incidents has found that failure to yield is a frequent catalyst for such events.

STATE OVERTIME ENFORCEMENT PROGRAMS:

The Department participates in a number of overtime enforcement programs funded by the Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA). Current programs include “Click It or Ticket” (seat belt enforcement) and “Smooth Operator” (aggressive driving). The Department maintains a zero-tolerance policy regarding seat belt violations and every seat belt violation requires the issuance of a citation (s) by a Cheverly officer. Please ensure that you and all of your vehicle’s passengers wear seat belts at all times.

NO SHAVE NOVEMBER

The beard craze will hit the Cheverly Police Department for the month of November, but for officers, it’s not just about looks. The Cheverly Police will participate in “No Shave November” to increase awareness by embracing our hair, which many cancer patients lose while fighting the battle against cancer. Officers who pledge a minimum donation of \$40.00 will be granted a month-long waiver from the department policy restricting facial hair growth. This campaign is open to the public and has been included in the Town’s newsletter, as well as the Departments Facebook page and Twitter account so that citizens may participate in making donations. Residential Parking Permits

Certain areas of Cheverly have been designated as Zone Parking Permit Areas due to heavy parking for the Cheverly Metro. Parking is limited to three (3) hours between 7:00 AM and 6:00 PM, Monday through Saturday, except for residents of the area who obtain and display Zone Parking Permits or a Guest Permit. **A PERMIT IS ONLY VALID IN THE ZONE DISPLAYED ON THE PERMIT.** Each Zone Parking Permit costs \$5.00. Two (2) Guest Permits are issued for each residence (not per vehicle) in a specific zone.

Zone Parking Requirements

- Zone parking applicants **MUST** have their vehicle registered to an address in Cheverly.
- Zone parking stickers are good for one (1) year and must be renewed annually.
- Zone parking permits must be affixed to the vehicle's **LEFT REAR BUMPER**, in a visible position.
- Visitor/Guest Permits are to be displayed on the interior rear view mirror, in a visible position.
- **Visitor/Guest Permits are for Bona Fide visitors only. They are not to be given to friends and relatives to park while they use the Cheverly Metro.**
- **Visitor/Guest Permits ARE NOT to be displayed on vehicles that are registered to addresses within Zone Parking Areas.**

Senior Citizen Parking

Cheverly residents 65 years or older may obtain a Senior Citizen parking permit. The permit is valid only for the short stretch of the east side of Cheverly Avenue (2200 Block). Senior Citizen Permits are **NOT** valid in any other area.

Residential ZONE Parking Permits

- You must have Vehicle Registration (registered to Cheverly address) to register your vehicle
- Parking Permits cost **\$5 per vehicle / One Guest Parking Permit allowed per residence at no cost.**
- \$2 for each additional Guest Parking Permit (**MAXIMUM 2 GUEST PERMITS PER RESIDENCE**)

If you live in one of the following zones, you will need a parking permit:

Zone 1: State Street [all]; 61st & 62nd Avenues, as well as the 1800 Block of 64th Avenue.

Zone 3: 2200, 2300, & 2400 Blocks of Cheverly Avenue

Zone 4: Arbor, Crestlawn

Zone 5: 2300 Belleview

Zone 6: Benton Road, as well as the 2300, 2400, & 2500 Blocks of Lake

Zone 7: 2400 Block of Valley Way

Zone 8: 3300 Block of Belleview, Medical Terrace

SR: The odd side of the 2200 Block of Cheverly Avenue

[This permit allows senior citizens 65 years of age or older to park your car in this area in order to utilize Metro].

Residential Parking Permits should be displayed on the back left bumper area.

If you have a regular zone permit and a SR permit display them next to each other on the back left bumper.

Guest Parking Permits shall be hung on Rear View mirror with information facing outward.

Citations may be issued to any resident not in compliance with Town Code 27-5.1: "Residential Zone Parking"

Cheverly Green Infrastructure Committee

Know Cheverly's Streams -- Cabin Branch and Lower Beaverdam Creek

Cabin Branch runs northward along Boyd Park and westward through the Old Fourth Ward to join the main branch of Lower Beaverdam Creek to continue to the Anacostia. The largest of Cheverly's natural areas, the Boyd Park-Cabin Branch Hub, includes the floodplains of Lower Beaverdam Creek and Cabin Branch, and Boyd Park. The floodplains preserve the largest patches of wildflowers in Cheverly. Boyd Park is especially rich in spring ephemeral plants such as blue violet, trout lily, spring beauty, toothwort, and May apple. The creeks support species found only around water, such as ducks, herons and kingfishers, beavers, and even the occasional otter. Boyd Park contains a small patch of hardwoods whose understory includes pawpaws. The park also has a hard surface fitness path, a playing field and picnic area, and the Cheverly Community Gardens. The floodplain is under federal protection, but its vegetation is severely threatened by invasive species such as lesser celandine. Only a short length of Lower Beaverdam Creek runs through Cheverly. In the nineteenth century the creek, then known as Beaver Dam Branch, powered at least one mill. The industry we now see along Lower Beaverdam Creek grew only after 1948, following an M-NCPPC plan opposed by Cheverly. Earlier, in 1933, Cheverly residents had successfully protested against a brewery on the creek, south of the present Metro parking lot. Until 1947-1948, when trunk sewers were installed along the creeks, raw sewage was routinely discharged into Lower Beaverdam Creek and Cabin Branch. In 1946 Cheverly parents were warned to keep their children out of contaminated Lower Beaverdam Creek. In recent years the Town of Cheverly and Friends of Lower Beaverdam Creek have supported annual stream cleanups involving hundreds of college students from midwestern states. In coming years we will see the effects of recent WSSC and Pepco activities along Cabin Branch and Lower Beaverdam Creek in Cheverly. When you visit our natural areas, remember – Take only pictures, leave only footprints, and tread lightly to preserve our natural treasures. Get ready for the Cheverly Day 2017 photo contest by thinking about water resources -- streams, wetlands, and springs, and the plants and animals that live in, on, and near them.

LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES



Vacuuming Leaves: Every street in Cheverly is scheduled for at least 2 vacuuming sweeps.

Rake leaves **between** the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk.

- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day
- Be considerate of your neighbors. Only rake to curb when your pick up day is imminent. Raking too early, allows the leaves to blow into your neighbors yard.

Bag or Container Leaves: Yard waste is collected on **MONDAYS**. Put bags or containers at the curb on Sunday evening. Place your leaves in **Paper Bags or a Trash can only**. Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags.
