

B&Es IN CHEVERLY – B&Es in the Town have risen steadily since the mid point of 2009. The first six (6) months of the year saw a total of 17 incidents; since July 1, however, there have been 34 such crimes. While these numbers match statistically a rise in such incidents across the region, especially in Prince George’s County, Cheverly is unique in that we have had eight (8) such B&Es occur in the nighttime. One logical conclusion drawn from this last statistics is that the suspects may be local residents with a familiarity with the Town. While the CPD has made a number of aggressive tactical moves to counter these crimes, and while the Town has additionally offered \$1,000 cash rewards for information leading to the arrests of these suspects, the overwhelming truth is that we need the help of the Cheverly public. Besides being vigilant and cautious, such as locking all doors and windows and recording serial numbers on laptops and other electronic equipment, the CPD needs your help in two specific areas. First, we need help in distributing a handout through the Town that discusses the current situation and any lookouts as well as tips that can help residents prevent or deter these crimes. A door-to-door distribution of this flyer among neighbors is a much more effective distribution method than the Newsletter, various blogs, and/or general word of mouth. Second, we need all of the eyes and ears of Cheverly residents trained toward any suspicious persons or vehicles they see around Town. Obvious suspicious events certainly include people cutting through backyards/alleys or utilizing the many Cheverly wooded areas as a means of getting around Town. Just as important, however, are people you do not recognize meandering through the Town with no apparent destination and with a concerted interest in passing homes or vehicles. Remember, suspicious is how you view events and your views do not have to be the same as your neighbors or the police in making such judgments. The Cheverly Police Department is committed to supporting you and all the residents of the Town. All you have to do is pick up the telephone and call!

TIP OF THE DAY – In the vast majority of nighttime B&Es, entry is made through a rear door or window of the home. One of the logical reasons for this choice of entry by suspects is the lack of appropriate lighting in these rear areas, which additionally, also allows these suspects to transverse backyards and alleys throughout the Town unnoticed by either vehicle or pedestrian traffic. To reduce these B&Es, effective and efficient lighting that does not intrude upon your neighbors is the key. To be effective, the lighting must cover a wide area. To be efficient, the lighting must be environmentally sound and low in cost. The solution is a photoelectric fluorescent lighting system. Photoelectric systems turn on automatically at dusk and off automatically at dawn and are not reliant on the resident being home to operate. Florescent lighting covers a large area, is

not intrusive, and is very cost effective. To work correctly, you must purchase this system as a single unit as fluorescent bulbs with a photoelectric insert are not functional due to a lack of ballast. The photoelectric fluorescent unit has the ballast built in and is available at general outlets such as Lowes and Home Depot.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTION REGARDING PENDING LEGISLATION TO AMEND THE TOWN CODE TO REQUIRE RECYCLING

Q1: The new refuse policy states that animal & human waste may not be placed in the trash, what does the town expect citizens to do?

A1: The new Ordinance allows citizens to place diapers and wrapped animal waste in the household refuse collections.

Q2: Why has the Town Council decided to pursue this new policy at this time?

A2: The Town Council has continued to explore avenues for reducing costs. "Tipping Costs" for recycling are \$0.0 per ton, while we pay 54.00 per ton for regular trash. This means that every house that is currently recycling is saving the town money. We anticipate that the town can save up to 20K if everyone recycles. Recycling saves money (tax dollars) and is an environmentally sound practice.

Q3: Required Recycling appears to be unenforceable; Is the Public Works department going to spot check trash bags?

A3: The Public Works department has no desire to open trash bags and look for recyclables, but if there is reason to do so, they may. Remember that Cheverly is charged by the ton for trash, so it is our desire to eliminate abuse that adds weight to the refuse stream. Therefore, Public Works will identify abuse by some tell tale signs: clanking of bottles in a heavy bag or exceptionally heavy bags that look like newspapers.

Q4: Required Recycling appears to be unenforceable; Is Public Works going to ticket me if I don't put out my recycling baskets?

A4: No. Public Works realizes that sometimes folks forget, are out of town, or simply don't generate enough recycling to warrant putting it out every week.

Q5: So if I mistakenly place two bottles or a gum wrapper in my trash, do I have to dig them out to ensure I don't get a ticket?

A5: No. The Town does encourage every citizen to recycle all materials that can be. However, we recognize that accidents do happen. Since we are only trying to stem abuse, the drafted policy contains language that allows a minimum of recyclables in the regular trash stream.

Q6: Recycling is confusing; I never know what can be put out in the recycling buckets?

A6: It is sometimes hard to remember what can be placed in town recycling bins. This information will also be in the Town Newsletter and on the website http://www.cheverly-md.gov/Pages/CheverlyMD_PubWorks/Recycling%20Items%20for%20website.pdf Cheverly is also one of the few areas in the county that recycles electronics. Other homeowners in the county must bring electronics to Brown Station themselves to be recycled. Please leave electronics separated from the other recyclables.

Q7: I received my recycling buckets back before the dinosaurs roamed the earth, and they look like the dinosaurs stepped on them can I get new buckets?

A7: Yes, please contact the Public Works department. You can stop there prior to work in the morning to pick up new buckets. Please bring your old one to exchange.

Q8: Why can't we get the fancy new 64 gallon buckets that come on wheels?

A8: As you might suspect 64 gallon trash cans filled with recyclables are very heavy and cannot be lifted without risk of injury by our staff. The town would need to invest \$100k to 120K to buy new trash cans and equip our trucks to lift these cans. This is something the town may consider in the future.

Q9: I recycle religiously and by the time Wednesday rolls around my recycling buckets are overflowing? What should I do?

A9: Recycling can be placed in any recyclable container, so you can use a large box or even put the recyclables in a large clear plastic lawn bag.

Q10: How will this policy be implemented, will this begin to be strictly enforced in January?

A10: No, the Town will use the months of January and February to educate citizens about the policy. Beginning in March the Town will start to place warnings on the citizen's front door. If the warning is ignored, the next time the Public Works Department will collect and sort the resident's trash to separate the recyclables and bill the owner for the staff time. If the owner does not pay the bill, the property will be liened for that amount and an administrative cost.

Q11: What happens if a neighbor places recyclables into my trash? Once I have left my trash on the sidewalk then anybody could corrupt it.

A11: As with all town policies, you will have the opportunity to contest any notice given to you by the Town. If you have a reasonable reply, the Town Administrator will listen. Further the ordinance requires that any recycling violation must be handled initially by a notice only to the resident.

**TRASH PICKUP ADJUSTMENTS
DUE TO WINTER STORMS:**

When weather makes it unsafe to operate the trash trucks on the street, collection may be temporarily suspended.

Back or side door pickups WILL NOT be made when heavy snow conditions prevail.

LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURES:

Vacuum Leaves: Every street is scheduled for a least 2 vacuuming sweeps.

Rake leaves only the day before your street pickup.

- Rake leaves between the curb and sidewalk - not on the sidewalk or in the street.
- Keep leaves free of branches, metal, concrete and other debris, that can jam or damage the equipment, causing expensive repairs and delays.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day.
