Message from the Chief Buddy Robshaw

When I first took over as Chief in August 2005, the crime picture looked grim. Crime was up approximately 23%, robberies were up by four from the year before at the same time, and theft from autos had steadily increased over the year. To combat this rise in crime, the Police Department developed a number of enforcement and crime prevention schemes in addition to receiving an allocation of overtime monies from the Mayor and Council for specific deterrence. With this additional money and guidance, and a great deal of help from individual citizens and Cheverly's Neighborhood Watch Group, crime was reduced to single digits by year's end. As a matter of fact, crime in November and December was the lowest since 1997 and 1994 respectively.

As I indicated earlier, there are a great deal of people to thank for this improvement. Individual members of the Police Department did an outstanding job, increasing arrests from the year before by 50%, traffic summons and citations by 25%, while at the same time, reducing complaints against police officers to nearly zero. This was particularly gratifying in that the Department remained understaffed nearly the entire year. In addition to individual officers, there were also a large number of individual citizens whose attention to detail and careful observation paid dividends by reducing certain types of crimes, causing the arrest of many perpetrators, and contributing greatly to the overall safety of the community. I will have more to say about these individuals later in this column.

While this citizen/police partnership made great strides in many crime areas, especially reducing the amount of burglaries in the Town, the robbery problem remained persistent throughout the year (24 robberies in 2004, 26 in 2005; 1 Carjacking in 2004, 7 Carjackings in 2005). Certain trends in robberies were also consistent. Suspects committing robberies were black males in their late teens, early 20's; almost all arrived or departed by way of an automobile (several were stolen vehicles); almost all the robberies targeted individuals walking alone; property and/or monies taken in these robberies tended to be minimal; and, in almost all of these robberies, the suspect was armed or inferred the presence of a weapon. In the first part of the year, robberies were mainly a nighttime event, and near the later part of the year, were mixed between daytime and nighttime.

I bring this robbery information to you, not to make you afraid of it, but to make you more observant about what is taking place around you. The Town of Cheverly is one of the safest places in Prince George's County, by far, but that does not mean we are immune from suspects who do nothing more than ride around this County looking for innocent victims to rob. There is no concern by robbers as to where these robberies occur, with no concern for political jurisdiction or lines on a map; they are only concerned with deriving an individual thrill from these crimes.

In the month of February, Cheverly's Neighborhood Watch Group is putting together a public service video concerning robberies and what we all can do to prevent them. In the meantime, the Po-

lice Department is committed to increasing directed patrol and putting additional officers on the street at varying hours. As a resident of the Town, please consider the following tips to reduce the likelihood you could become a victim:

- ☑ **Never walk alone** if at all possible. At the very least, try to walk as close to other people going in the same direction.
- ☑ **If you see a suspicious person** or occupied vehicle, go to the closest house and knock on the door. Have that resident call the police.
- ☑ **Be especially observant** of vehicles traveling slowly and looking at you and your surroundings. Take the time to note the type of vehicle and, if possible, write down the license number.
- ☑ **Always carry your cellular telephone** with you. In the event of an emergency, call the police right away - do not wait until you get home.
- ☑ **As an added precaution, purchase a whistle.** If you see someone or something suspicious, a whistle brings a great deal of attention to you and to your potential problem. Do not use chemical sprays or any other self-defense weapon unless you are thoroughly familiar with them. Remember, these weapons can be taken away and used against you if you are not careful.

In conjunction with these tips, and as a means of planning directed patrol routes, I am requesting that any person who walks to and from the Cheverly Metro contact the Police Department. What we would like to know is the approximate times you are walking to and from the Metro and your ultimate destination when you leave the Metro in the afternoon/night. This information will be

kept strictly confidential and will be used for planning purposes only.

The next **Citizens Advisory Council/Neighborhood Watch Meeting** is **Wednesday, February 22, 2006, at 7:00 PM.** We will start breaking down into committee groups. If you have not attended a meeting lately, the Council has committees on Elderly Visitation, Pedestrian Safety, Cheverly Day, Citizen Awards, and FOCUS. FOCUS is the title of a series of public safety videos the Council is currently working on. We welcome one and all residents. If you have any questions about the Council or its committee work, please do not hesitate to call me at 301-773-8362 or Email at policechief@cheverly-md.gov. As always, refreshments are served at every meeting.

Just a couple of quick reminders:

- ◆ You must activate your headlights anytime weather conditions cause you to use your windshield wipers. This is not only a safety tip, but Maryland law.
- ◆ As a pedestrian, you must cross a divided highway at a crosswalk.
- ◆ If you leave an unregistered, abandoned, or inoperable vehicle on the public streets of the Town of Cheverly, it will be immediately impounded.
- ◆ We have never had a vehicle stolen in this Town when "The Club" antitheft device was properly deployed. Come up to the police station today and purchase yours for \$10.00.
- ◆ **If you know of an elderly or infirmed person that is living alone, please give me a call or send an Email.** The Neighborhood Watch is initiating a police visitation program designed to ensure the safety of our elderly residents. Visiting officers will inform them what their police department is doing, present crime prevention and home safety information, and listen directly to their

fears, problems, and complaints. Finally, please take the time to have your home inspected by the Cheverly Police as part of the **Police/Homeowner Anti-Burglary Partnership.** The inspection takes about an hour, during which time, the homeowner is presented with a wide

range of prevention techniques. The inspection is free of charge, and the general cost to bring your home up to good safety standard is usually less than \$100.00. Those who pass the inspection receive a permanent Partnership sign, access to electronic markers, and help recording serial numbers and other identification markers. **Call the Police Department today at 301-773-8362.**

NOTICE to Rental Property Owners - Eviction Law Changes

Prince George's County Council passed CB-26 into law, which made changes to the eviction process in Prince George's County. The Eviction Law Changes took effect on August 11th for single-family rentals.

The new law prohibits the placement of tenant's property in a public right-of-way or on any public property. For most evictions, this law will require the owner of the property to either rent a dumpster and dump all of the tenant's property in the dumpster after removing it from the house, or hire someone to haul the tenant's property out of the house and bring it immediately to the dump or transfer station.

In any case, property owners MAY NOT leave the tenant's property at the curb. In addition, the law also states that if the tenant is present at the time the eviction is executed, the owner of the property must give the tenant a reasonable period of time (not to exceed four hours) to remove his/her property.

WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

TOWN CODE - Sec. 27-10—Parking

A snow emergency shall exist whenever snow has accumulated on the streets to a depth of one (1) inch or more. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective without any notification and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed; provided, however, that when snow shall accumulate to a depth of one inch or more after 11:00PM, the provisions of this subsection shall not be effective until 7:00AM the day following and shall remain in effect until the street is plowed.



PARKING RESTRICTIONS: During a snow emergency no person shall park any vehicle as follows:

- On the cul-de-sac portion of any street,
- On any courts,
- On the even-numbered side of all streets,
- (exception) On the odd-numbered side of 59th Avenue, and one block of Inwood Street between Cheverly Avenue & Belleview Avenue.

NOTE: The snow emergency parking restrictions do not override existing no-parking zones or apply to streets where enforcement would disallow all parking because of a no-parking zone, or to streets with any barrier or strip dividing lanes of traffic.

PRIORITIES: The snow removal operations work under the following priorities: 1.) Cheverly Avenue 2.) principal connecting streets: Forest Road, Crest Avenue, Valleyway, Greenleaf Road, 62nd Avenue, State Street, Schuster Drive; 3.) all other streets.

SAFETY REMINDER: We ask residents to remember that your neighbors who walk to Metro, or children walking to school, and the hard working Mail Carriers are exposed to dangerous conditions when sidewalks are not cleared in a timely manner. Failure to comply with Town Code could result in fines.

TOWN CODE Sec. 18-4.1—SIDEWALKS Whenever snow accumulates to a depth of one inch or more, it is the duty of each occupant to clear the snow

from the sidewalk adjacent to that property, within 12 hours after the snow ceases, (unless at night, in which case it shall be removed within 12 hours after sunrise). Snow and ice removed from sidewalks shall NOT be deposited on streets or other sidewalks. When ice forms on sidewalks, occupant shall place sand, ashes or other such material on sidewalks within 6 hours, (unless at night, in which case it can be spread by noon of the next day). Icy spots on public property can be reported to Public Works at **301-773-2666**.
